Mississippi:

Climb CDC Conservation Corps - The CLIMB Conservation Corps is a for hire conservation workforce that engages motivated young adults, ages 18 -25, to complete challenging and impactful conservation and service projects throughout Mississippi. Projects may include, trail construction & maintenance, habitat improvement, hazardous fuels reduction, re-vegetation and local environmental service projects. Crews may also complete technical and/or specialized projects depending on project partner needs, including disaster relief if the opportunity arises.

Each crew consists of 6 members and 2 leaders. Our programs focus on place based learning, life skills development, conservation service work, appreciation of diversity, civic responsibility, and career development. CCC also provides an opportunity for members to learn about the local environment, environmental issues, and get introductions to recreation and resource management careers. Climb CDC – Environmental and Conservation Program Manager - The primary responsibility of the Environmental and Conservation Program Manager is to facilitate opportunities for corps members to develop work skills, provide leadership experience, increase their community involvement, improve their knowledge of the environment and gain valuable teaching and public speaking skills. The Program Manager will oversee the education programs and training of participants and is responsible for communicating with project sponsors to ensure the successful delivery of the project's desired outcomes. Additionally, the Program Manager will ensure environmental trainings are conducted and eligible participants have the certifications in areas such as invasive species removal, Hazwoper training, NMIS and more. The Program Manager will support the mission of the CLIMB Conservation Corps by using his or her management, supervisory, technical and personal skills to develop the skills of young people, which will enable them to plan and pursue their own goals while also delivering environmental and conservation focused programs to schools and community members. S/he accomplishes this mission by further developing training programs, ensuring education programs are aligned with current educational standards, evaluating programs and collecting data to facilitate the generation of necessary reports. The Program Manager will be responsible for the execution and completion of all field projects. The Program Manager is also responsible for building relationships between the Corps and other private and public organizations to develop employment, training, and educational opportunities for participants. Gulf Wide:

The Nature Conservancy – GulfCorps Program – Specialist: (Mobile, AL): (Posting closes on July 13th, 2018) - The Nature Conservancy has launched a new Gulf restoration project that aims to create 300 jobs over 3 years along the Gulf of Mexico. The GulfCorps project is made possible by a RESTORE Act grant administered by NOAA and will provide crews with marketable skills in the restoration economy taking shape in the Gulf. The Nature Conservancy

is working in collaboration with critical partners at The Corps Network (TCN) and the Student Conservation Association (SCA). The GulfCorps Program integrates conservation and restoration principles with workforce development through utilization of conservation corps in all five Gulf states. The GulfCorps Program Specialist (GCPS) is part of The Nature Conservancy's (TNC) Gulf of Mexico Whole System Program. The Whole Systems Program is tasked with adding capacity to TNC Chapters along the Gulf of Mexico, while also participating in multi-state and regional projects. The GCPS works under the direction of the GulfCorps Program Director handling operations for the GulfCorps Program. The person in this position is responsible for writing contracts and sub-award; developing conservation and restoration project scopes through collaboration with RESTORE Act Representatives, NOAA, Federal and State Agencies, non-profits and other entities; developing monitoring plans, data collection and reporting; and working with sub-awardees and maintaining quality control for the deliverables of the Program. The GulfCorps Program Specialist may lead or monitor work groups engaged in conservation and restoration activities. Funding for this position is secured by a grant through June 30, 2020.
